

## Genealogy of William McGaughey and Prepare Clark

MC12—**William “Old Bill” McGaughey** was born (1762) and died on September 22, 1829 in Blakesburg, Putnam Co., Indiana, buried at the Blakesburg Cemetery, Russell Township, Putnam Co., Indiana. William was married on December 2, 1788 in Cumberland Co., Pennsylvania to **Prepare Clark** (daughter of **John Gridley Clark** and **Frances McClinic**). Prepare Clark was born in 1771 in Virginia, died on May 16, 1835 in Blakesburg, Putnam Co., Indiana, buried at the Blakesburg Cemetery, Russell Township, Putnam Co., Indiana. It was once said William was the first to be buried at the Blakesburg Cemetery. William was known as **William McGahey**. The date of William's and Prepare's marriage comes from page [677] of the family Bible.

I visited the grave site of William McGaughey and Prepare McGaughey during the Summer of 1990 and found several interesting facts. It seems that the original stones have been replaced by newer ones. Each stone has a new one replacing it, with the older one attached to the back of the newer one. All information on both stones match the information on the other. William has a Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) marker on the front of his base stone. It appears when the DAR placed the marker on William's grave, they did a little more by reinforcing both William's and Prepare's head stones with a slab of concrete.

The date of William's death on his stone reads, Sep 2 1829, this disagrees with the information supplied already. Prepare's leaves an interesting question. How do you spell Prepare's name. The grave markers have her name spelled Preppar. So it makes you wonder if the person that put Prepare's name in the family Bible, spelled it as it was pronounced or did the person that engraved the stone spell it as he thought it should be or as he was told to spell it.

In a book of about the history of Putnam County, Indiana, I came across a one line that mentioned William McGaughey the Revolutionary War soldier was the first to be buried at the Blakesburg Cemetery. This makes it very possible that William and Prepare must have lived in the proximity of the cemetery.

William McGaughey's family Bible is still in existence. In 1951, it was in the possession of the late Dr. Walter McGaughey's family, having been the property of his grandfather Michael McGaughey's family, the tenth child of William and Prepare. At the time of the printing the 1990 edition, the Bible was in the possession of Leslie McGaughey Leffler of Cincinnati, Ohio.

Some of the entries in the Bible are illegible, they are, and careless handling have brought damage to it. The Bible is inscribed as follows: *"This Bible was bought the sixth day of May in the year of our Lord one Thousand eight hundred and twentyfour; bought by William McGahey, Price Eight Dollars and Twenty five cents"– "William McGahey and Preppar Clark was married on the Second Day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Eighty Eight." "William McGahey was born in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and." (–eligible, but looks like Sixty two)– "Prepare Clark was born in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy-one." – "William McGahey deceased this life the twenty second day of September 1829. Preppar McGahey deceased this life of 16th of May 1835."*

Other entries in the Bible are of births, marriages, and deaths of their children and grandchildren. Early entries, the names are spelled McGahey, later ones are McGaughey. Entries in the Bible were made at different times and in different handwriting. Both ink and pencil being used, the ink showing different age.

The following data was obtained from the papers on file in pension claim, S.36696, of William McGahey, based upon his military services in the Revolutionary War: *The date, place of birth, and name of William McGahey's (surname also shown as McGahay) His parents were not given.– William McGahey enlisted, October, 1778, or September or October, 1779 in Carlisle, Cumberland Co., Tuscarora Valley, Pennsylvania, served as a private in Captain Pratt's, 4<sup>th</sup> Company, Colonel William Butler's 1<sup>th</sup> Pennsylvania regiment, Commanded by General Anthony Wayne and was discharged at Carlisle, Pennsylvania, in the Fall of 1781.– He was allowed pension of his application executed on June 17, 1818, at which time he was aged about fiftythree years and living in Bath Co., Kentucky. He signed William McGahey. – In 1820, living in Bath Co., Kentucky, stated that he was aged about fiftyseven years, (no explanation of the discrepancy in ages given) and had living with him, his wife (name not given), aged forty-seven years and four children (names follows) Patsey, aged seventeen yrs; Samuel, aged thirteen yrs.; James, aged eleven yrs; and Michael, aged seven yrs.– William McGahey was allowed one hundred acres of bounty land, for his service on Warrant No., 1004, issued December 6, 1821. In 1826, William*

McGahey was a resident of Putnam Co., Indiana; in the same year, a John McGahey was living in the county, relationship to William was not stated, (suspect this to be his oldest son. In 1828, William McGahey was living in Putnam Co., Indiana and requested that his mail be addressed to Blakesburg, Indiana.

Description of William McGahey in "MD. Egle's 1900 Vol." in the War Service records: "William McGahey, No. 84, to serve during the war about 5 foot, 5 inches, about 18 years of age, brown hair, fair complexion, hazel eyes, born in York Co., last place of residence, Fermanagh Twp., Cumberland Co., PA, by trade of wheelwright. (one whose trade in the building and repairing of wheels).

In the above paragraph, it states that William was born in York County, with no state mentioned, but according to the tradition, William came from County Cork, Ireland in time to join the war. I thought they may have made an error and typed York instead of Cork, but if they had done this, then why did they put the word "County" after York, like they do with counties in America and not with the word "County" before Cork as they do in Ireland. Entry into the Revolutionary War, if a state was not mentioned in the records, it was presumed to be the state the soldier entered the war.

#### Last Will and Testament of William McGaughey

The following is the transcribed will and inventory of William McGaughey which was taken from the Probate Records, in the Putnam County Court House, Indiana.

State of Indiana )  
Putnam County )

Please held before the Honorable Judge of Probate Court of Putnam County Indiana at the Court House in Greencastle on the 2nd day of January 1830.

Wm McGaughey, deceased—Be it known theretofore to wit on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of November 1829, in open court, William Sutherlin produced and proved the following will which is in the words and figures to wit:

In the name of God Amen, I William McGaughey, of the County of Putnam and State of Indiana, being weak and frail in body, but perfect in mind and memory, thanks be given unto God, calling into mind the mortality of my body and knowing that is appointed for all men to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament, that is to say principally and first of all, I give recommend by soul into the hands of the Almighty God that give it, and my body I recommend to the earth, to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executor, nothing doubting that at the general resurrection, I shall revive the same again by the Mighty Power of God, Life, and as touching such worldly estate, wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life, give dismiss, and dispose of the same in the manner or form following list. I give and bequeath unto my will beloved wife, all my household goods and movable effects. 2nd, I give and bequeath to my will beloved sons James and Michael McGahey the sum of one hundred dollars, out of the money received from the sale of the plantation that I now live on, when sold and the remainder to be divided among my children, namely, Fanny, John, Andrew, Margaret, Patsy, William, Samuel, James and Michael McGaughey. Know ye that I constitute, make and ordain William Sutherlin the sole executor of this my last will and testament, and I do hereby disallow, revoke, and disannul all & every other former Testament and will and legacies bequeathed, and Execute by me in anyway before named will and bequeathed, ratifying and confirming this and no other to be by my last will and testament.

In witness whereof, I have herewith set my hand and seal this fourth day of July in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine.

Known, all men by these presents that we William Sutherlin and Joseph Orr both of Putnam County Indiana are held and firmly bound unto the State of Indiana in the penal sum of two thousand lawful money of the State of Indiana to the payment of which will and truly to be made we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors, and administrators formally by these present sealed with our seals and dated this 3rd day of November 1929. The Condition of this obligation is such that if the above mentioned William Sutherlin shall will and truly execute the duties of Executor of the estate of William McGaughey and do all things faithfully. According to Law in relation to his said trust. As such executor thru this obligation to be void otherwise to be in full force in law signed William Sutherlin (seal) and Joseph Orr (seal). Test G. F. Waterman and afterward towit at a Probate Court held for said County on the 1st day of March 1930, the said executor filed her inventory in the words and figures following towit. We William Sutherlin, Fendle Sutherlin, and James Bracheu do certify that we have found the following property and appraised the as here below set down as the property of the late William McGaughey deceased.

William and Prepare sold their land in Bath Co., Ky, recorded on September 14, 1825 in Owingsville, Kentucky. 125 acres he received \$600 in silver, it was "where he now lived" this was 1825, showing they were selling their home prior to comingo Indiana. This farm was on the East Fork of Moffit Creek, Kentucky. – William and his family came on horse back.It was said a Wilson family traveled with them. – William's name appears on a wall tablet in Putnam County Courthouse, Indiana.These are the names of the Revolutionary War soldiers of Putnam Co., dedicated by the Daughters of the American Revolution. His name is spelled William McGaughey– Prepare was of Dutch descent, married at the age of 17 to William McGahey. Their trek south to Kentucky has not been found until we find her brother, James Clark's will being recorded in 1805 in Montgomery Co., Kentucky.He speaks of his mother Frances Clark, his brothers John Clark and Samuel Clark, his sisters, Martha Clark, married to James Butdse Margaret Clark, married to John Dougherty; Elizabeth Cark, married in 1799 to Isaac Butcher, son of James Butcher; Prepare Clark McGahey; sister, Frances Clark Corell, married in 1799 in Fleming Co., Kentucky to Bartholmew Correll. Samuel probably was married on September 3, 1798 to Polly Williams.

With a little research I was able to find thèrelationship between Prepare Clark to William Clark the explorer (of the famed Lewis and Clark Expeditions)*Prepare was the daughter ofwas John Gridley Clark. John was the son ofJames Clark.James had a brother named Jonathan Clark.Jonathan had a son named John Clark. John had a large family of eleven children.The tenth child born was the explorer William Clark* William McGaughey and Prepare Clark had the fllowing children:

MC121—**Frances “Fanny” McGahey (McGaughey)** was born on September 5, 1789 in Kentucky. Frances was married on March 10 1829 in Russell Township, Putnam Co., Indiana to **Zadock Conner** (son of **Daniel I. Conner** and **Mary**). Zadock was born on February 10, 1780 in Montgomery Co., Virginia and died on September 13, 1854 in Franklin Township, Putnam Co., Indiana and buried at the Guilliams Cemetery Putnam Co., Indiana. –Note: *In the 1820 census Frances and Zadock lived in Montgomery Co., Virginia.In the 1830 census they lived in Putnam Co.Indiana. In the 1850 census they lived Franklin Township Putnam Co., Indiana. Frances was 40 years old when she married Zadock. She probably came to Putnam Co. from Kentucky in the mid 1820's. Court records in Owingsville Bath Co., Kentucky shows that her father William McGahey sold 125 acres located on the east fork of Moffit Creek for 600 dollars silver. In June 1818 aactm was executed allowing him pension for his services in the Revolution. Documents related to this claim indicated that the soldier was living in Putnam Co. Indiana in 1826. William McGahey's family Bible notes the date of her marriage to Zadock and thebirth date of Andrew Conner their oldest child. Andrew is B. J. Conner's grandfather. Frances was the oldest child of William and Prepare (Clark) McGaughey. William was a patriot soldier of the American Revolution. His name is on a bronze tablet in theiram Co. Courthouse, along with other Revolutionary War Veterans of the County. B. J. Conner was accepted in the Washington Chapter of WichitaKansas National Society of Sons of the American Revolution as a descendant of William McGahey national member No. 147041. – The following story was told to Louis McGaughey (MC1210.42) by his father, Samuel (MC1210.4) who was a close neighbor to Frances: Frances was said to have a strange power to cure animals, because of this she was sometimes referred to as a with, still people did not hesitate to take their sick animals to hdtle had a sick horse and expected it to die, they went tbanny's house to get her, but she said she was too old to go to the horse, as the horse was not far away theywhipped it to its fjet and made some progress, after resting, this was repeated until they got it close to her house. She came out and told them to go in the house. Samuel's wife went in, but Samuel went around the house and watched her from as distance to see what she would do. She put her hand on the horse andalked to her calling her by name, but he could not hear what else she said. In a few moments she called to Samuel and told them to take the animal across the road where there was blue grass and let it graze, whiat did immediately. She wanted to teach this strange povers to David Guilliams, she said, she could no pass it on to anyone that was kin to her. David didn't want to learn, but manyears later when it was too late, he regretted*

it. Zaddock was previously married to **Jane Smith** (daughter of **William Rose Smith, Jr.** and **Frances Guilliams**). Zaddock and Frances had the following children:

MC121.1—**Andrew “Ned” Conner** was born on April 15, 1830 in Russell Township, Putnam Co., Indiana. Andrew was married on November 2, 1854 in Terre Haute, Vigo Co., Indiana to **Susan Barbara Venard** (daughter of **Stephen Venard** and **Mary Anne Hamilton**). Susan was born in 1835 in Indiana.—Note: *In 1850, Andrew was employed as a blacksmith. It was known that his mother Frances had one son Ned; this may be a nickname as there was an entry in the family Bible, Andrew Conner was born April 15, 1830. Andrew was a blacksmith for most of his life in Terre Haute, Virgo Co., Indiana. Susan's Venard (Venyard) ancestors are listed in the Pennsylvania State Archives among the settlers who served during the American Revolution as Frontier Rangers from Washington Co., Pennsylvania employed against the Indians of the Seneca tribe, and the western tribes of the Ohio country. Starting in March 28 1781 they served as Frontier Rangers until the end of hostilities in late 87. Frontier Rangers made frequent forays into wilderness areas along the frontier and between blockhouses to discover and overtake bands of Indians before sufficient numbers could gather to attack white settlements.* Andrew and Susan Barbara had the following children:

MC121.11—**Laura Conner** was born in 1856, Terre Haute, Vigo Co., Indiana and died on September 8, 1878 in Terre Haute, Vigo Co., Indiana and was buried at the Woodlawn Cemetery, Terre Haute, Vigo Co., Indiana. Laura lived in Lost Creek Township, Vigo Co., Indiana.

MC121.12—**Emma Conner** was born in September 1859 in Terre Haute, Vigo Co., Indiana. Emma lived her life in Terre Haute, Vigo Co., Indiana. It isn't known if Emma was ever married.

MC121.13—**Mary Frances “Fanny” Conner** was born on October 28, 1862 in Terre Haute, Vigo Co., Indiana and died on December 6, 1947 in Wynona, Osage Co., Oklahoma and buried at the Dewey Cemetery in Dewey, Washington Co., Oklahoma. Fanny was married to **Ulysses Grant Swank** (son of **George Swank** and **Nancy A. Mikel**). Grant was born on December 25, 1865 in Macon Co., Missouri and died on July 5, 1946 in Dewey, Washington Co., Oklahoma.—Obituary: *Mrs. Mary Frances Swank, age 83, passed away at 10 p.m. Dec. 6 at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Alice Martin Wynonna, Okla. Mrs. Swank had been a resident of Dewey for a number of years. One year and seven months ago she went to make her home with her daughter. She is survived by four daughters, Mrs. Alice Martin Wynonna, Okla.; Mrs. Cora Campbell, Stockton, Calif.; Mrs. Nina Leonard Coffeyville, Kan.; Mrs. Hazel Kenny, Tulsa, Okla.; one son, Mr. Ezekial Swank, Hooker, Okla.; one sister, Mrs. Cora Lempke, Roford, Idaho; 17 grandchildren and 13 great-grandchildren. Funeral services will be held at 2 o'clock Tuesday, Dec. 9, in the Hurt Funeral home chapel. Rev. R. C. Kinningham of the Church of Christ officiated. Internment will be in the Dewey cemetery.* According to the 1880 census, Grant and Mary lived in Lost Creek Township, Vigo Co., Indiana; in 1880 they lived in Terre Haute, Vigo Co., Indiana; in 1900 they lived in Cherokee Nation Indian Territory; in 1910 they lived in Strike Axe Township, Osage Co., Oklahoma; finally in 1930 census Grant and Mary lived in Dewey, Washington Co., Oklahoma. Ulysses was employed as a grocery store operator and later as a laborer. Grant and Mary had the following children:

Benjamin and Lonnie lived in Strike Axe Township, Osage Co., Oklahoma in 1910 and in 1917 Benjamin was a shooter at Dewey Portland Cement Rock Company in Dewey, Washington Co., Oklahoma.
